How to Study the Start of a New Chapter

Don't panic...I know this looks like a lot!

Really, getting down to step 10 should not take more than 5 minutes. ©

If you can get into the habit of doing this, it will significantly help your learning.

- 1. Turn to the title page for the chapter.
- 2. On the prior page is a section titled "Where You've Been"...review this.
 - This will help refresh what we learned to date that is needed for this chapter.
 - It helps build that "learning framework" we talked about.
- 3. At least scan through the "Diagnosing Readiness" problems.
 - If you see a problem you are not sure about, work through it. In green beside it is where to go in the text for help.
- 4. Go back to the chapter title page.
- 5. Read the "Where You're Going" section.
 - This will extend the "learning framework" helping you see where we're going and why.
- 6. Read each of the lesson titles.
 - The titles are the major concepts we will be learning.
- 7. Read through the "Key Vocabulary" ... just start to get these words in your head.
 - If you are curious, the page number for the definition is noted by each word.
- 8. Turn to the first lesson in the chapter.
- 9. Read the "Lesson Preview".
 - Note the lesson objectives "What You'll Learn" and the "Why".
- *** it should take no more than 5 minutes to get here ***
- 10. Read the lesson, **taking notes** and working through the examples.
- 11. Go online and read the online lecture. Add to your notes as needed.
